

Do I remember VE Day 1945?

I was asked if I could write about my memory of that day and to be honest I could not.

We must have known that it was not the real end of the war and that there was still dreadful fighting in the Far East against Japan. Living in a village in Somerset at the time with only BBC News to listen to, not remembering ever going to the cinema until the war really was over, and only seeing a few photographs of the London celebrations in the newspaper the next day it is perhaps not surprising.

But I have a few very vivid memories from before that momentous day.

We lived in a village in north Kent. I can remember being called in twice from the garden to listen to national announcements on the radio. I can still hear in 1938 Neville Chamberlain's voice on his return from Munich. Much more vividly, I recall the stentorian tones of Mr Churchill in September 1939 announcing that we were now at war with Germany.



At the beginning of the war, my convent school decided that we should be evacuat-

ed to a sister school in Abingdon but my father thought that was not a good idea as he could imagine the Germans bombing factories at Cowley nearby! So instead my mother took my sister and I to stay in a village in Yorkshire with her cousin.

This cousin had a friend in the village. We were asked to tea one day and this woman's son was there, on leave from the RAF. I can remember the sitting room vividly where we were having tea. However I did not register at the time that this rather famous pilot son had two false tin legs!!

The war was going through its phoney stage so we returned home to Kent just in time for the Dunkirk retreat! I can still remember the fear everywhere of an immediate invasion. Then we had the Battle of Britain over our heads, often watching it ready to dive into the Anderson Shelter! My most vivid memory is of September 15th 1940, during the Battle of Britain, when scores of German bombers droned overhead on their way to bomb London. Then there was the excitement of the German bombers scurrying home chased by our Spitfires and Hurricanes. We cheered and cheered. It was not always a time to cheer because sometimes I remember seeing German bombers jettison their remaining bombs over the Kent countryside in the rush to get away across the Channel.

As the school had been evacuated, my parents arranged for us to be schooled by a ferocious retired schoolmistress who lived in our village. My sister and I went to her kitchen each morning where she taught me mostly English Grammar and long division and multiplication using used paper bags and pencils to work with. But I have never forgotten the good grammar she instilled into me - and parsing!

Because my father had been recruited to build war factories we led a fairly nomadic life and in 1944 were living in the north Somerset countryside. My sister and I were allowed to go out on long bicycle rides. This is my last most vivid memory. Goodness knows where it was but we rode down a very tiny lane with banks and high hedges and suddenly came across masses of tanks and other army vehicles hidden under camouflage netting. And the soldiers with these tanks and vehicles were Americans to our amazement and not British. We had not seen an American before and went home very excited to tell our parents about our adventure.

In retrospect they must have been assembling the invasion forces in relative secrecy before moving them to the south coast for departure. Do you think my sister and I knew more than the Germans?!

Finally with reference to VE Day I think I must have been revising for my School Certificate exams.

The lockdown life has had changed the way we live because we can't go out whenever we please and we can't go out whenever we please and we can't just go out clothes shopping we now have to stay indoors but on the plus side of everything that's going on I have done things I wouldn't have done if we weren't in lockdown like gardening, painting, baking bread, biscuits moving shingle with mum in the garden two tonne of it!

This virus makes me feel depressed because of all the deaths and cases of ill people. I made a picture and sent it to the Nightingale Hospital I hope somebody sees it and they feel better looking at it.

Although it is strange when we have our daily walk or cycle I see so much wildlife that I don't see if there are lots of cars and people around like Hares, different birds, deers on our back field and how much everything changes without all of these cars and pollution while people are not allowed to drive their cars so much. I hope that we can get out of lockdown and that everyone in the village that has had this dreadful virus gets through the virus and is fine after.

We are now able to meet a friend again. How wonderful to sit and have morning coffee or afternoon tea together, even from two meters, that social contact feels good.


Mays biggest highlight for members has been the resumption of brown bin collections, a slot at the recycling center and a visit to a garden center. I suppose it's a small taste of normality!

Cockfield Parish Council Notes

Summary report of the Ordinary Parish Council meeting held 30 April 2020



The Parish Council held another successful online virtual meeting via Skype. Unfortunately, district councilor Margret Mayberry suffered log-in issues so could no join us.

It was noted that eight action items had closed between meetings Two items remain in progress concerning the pavilion Three items are ongoing on maintenance in conjunction with other wider maintenance / asset matters

The appointing of a contractor for the play equipment replacement project, would remain on hold until such time as further guidance was issued on working practices and the availability of the contractor to establish a way forward.

Public Participation Session:

County Councillor: The meeting welcomed back Robert Lindsey after his period away following a recent health issue which did not allow him to attend a number of meetings. He gave an overview of reduced County Council activity in the lockdown and headlines from his written report of care homes, bus cuts, bid for bus funding, food banks, school meals and school travel.

District Councillor:

The meeting received an update on planning department works during lockdown, ongoing work on the JLP, Business support grants, waste and recycling operations during the lockdown together with issues of reduced BMDSC staffing being hit by absences.

An extensive discussion occurred on whether the timing was due to update the Village Development Plan, Local Needs Housing Survey and the further merit of completing a "Neighbourhood Plan".

It was noted that based on other villages experiences a Neighbourhood plan can take circa 2-3 years to prepare and be finally adopted. Further, these usually require significant external expertise to support the parish councils although some funding is available from central sources to help with this.

All of these options may be challenging at this time, nevertheless Clive Arthey would seek guidance from departments at BMSDC on the best approach to update the village's position.

The Parish Council Supported this application

DC/20/01217 - Outline Planning Application (some matters reserved, access to be considered) - Erection of 4 no. detached dwellings (with access) and revised car parking for The Three Horseshoes. Three Horseshoes Stows Hill Cockfield Bury St Edmunds Suffolk IP30 0JB. (Consultation Submission Deadline 12/04/20, extended until 05/05/20).

The Parish Council objected to this application (the formal response can be seen on the BMSDC planning portal)

DC/20/01352 – Outline Planning Application (some matters reserved, access to be considered) – Erection of 2 No. Detached dwellings and associated Garages (with access). Land North of Howe Lane, Cockfield, Suffolk (Consultation Submission Deadline 26/04/20, extended until 05/05/20).

The Parish Council objected to this application (the formal response can be seen on the BMSDC planning portal)

Finance:

The meeting pre-authorised the schedule of regular payments (for up 12 months) in accordance with Financial Regulations.

The meeting acknowledged the emergency repair order placed with Binder Ltd (in accordance with Financial Regulations, Item 4.5 and Chairman's action.

The meeting acknowledged the order placed with T Sheppard to dismantle & remove the composite concrete/timber seat on the Great Green, near the former Garage site which was in a dangerous condition and to store the concrete sections until a decision is taken on its replacement.

Pavilion Update:

Remedial drainage works are on-going and the financial excess contribution remains stable with our insurer.

Maintenance:

A working group would investigate a number of maintenance actions required. Scope and quotations to be determined;

Whether to repair/refurbish the 3 No. composite concrete/timber benches on the Great Green, or replace them with 3 No. new timber benches.



Repair the window frame, facia and roof trim/finial on the Bandstand, Great Green.

Proposal to concrete the 'No Parking Sign' into the ground near the Pavilion, Great Green.



Proposal to replace the existing Noticeboard at the Great Green with one or more new half glazed/lockable, half unglazed Noticeboard(s), together with their locations.

Coronavirus:

Meetings: Councillors to note that:

Physical Ordinary Parish Council Meetings on future meeting 28/05/20 has been replaced by Virtual Meeting using Skype Video Conferencing, whilst the meeting scheduled for 25/06/20 will be determined nearer the time.

Assistance for Residents and support for local groups was working well.

Working Groups, Representatives to External Bodies, Officers and Portfolio Holders:

Reports were by exception only and the only item of merit was as below:

Local Needs Housing – Working on site was soon to recommence with suitable measure for safety of the operatives.

<u>Cockfield Parish Council Community Infrastructure Levy</u> (<u>Regulation 123 Fund</u>) – <u>application for the</u> <u>"Cockfield Adventure Playground"</u>

In October 2019 the Parish Council lodged an application with BMSDC for a funding contribution to the upgrade of the play equipment at Great Green. The Parish Council have subsequently been advised that their application has been successful in the round of bidding announced in March 2020.

The Parish Council have been awarded a £25,000.00 contribution

The bid was supported by demonstrating a community willingness to also provide substantive funding toward the project and not rely on the generosity of the authority. Other funding streams are:

Cockfield Parish Council Neighbourhood CIL	£20,000.00
Cockfield Parish Council (Earmarked Reserves)	£5,000.00
Cockfield Parish Council Unspent of Precept 2019	/20 £2,206.00
Cockfield Community Council Donation	£5,000.00

This continues the success that the Parish has had with CIL bidding and demonstrates we are an an active village which was recognised by the committee at BMSDC as a worth-while "investment".

I would like to thank all those involved, and the tremendous efforts made which has brought an excellent result. This included many meetings with specialist providers and the exploring of various options with visits to other sites in and around the area to understand how other villages have enhanced their offerings.

In particular thanks go to our District Councillor Clive Arthey who advised us on the process and administrative requirements of the bid. Given these are becoming more onerous to satisfy, with BMSDC having revised its criteria for bidding. In this vain the Parish Clerk who spent an immense period gathering the necessary documentation to provide what has to be an exemplar bid portfolio.

Our funding application was based on our preferred contractor who has a range of apparatus that will cater for a wide range of ages within the village and surrounding catchment. The selection should give active engagement for many years to come.

A summary of the equipment that we wish to install is varied;

Nest Swing Adventure Trail with rubber stepping post & feet at ground level Forest Stack 2 on steel feet Waxham 5 Adventure Tower on steel feet Licham 4 Adventure Tower Timber Arial Runway on steel feet with 50 m² safergrass matting Skywalker with 23 m² safergrass matting Picnic table / bench Removal of the existing equipment with remodelling and landscaping

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING ARRANGEMENTS UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.



In line with Government advice, the Parish Council will no longer be holding physical Ordinary or Extraordinary Parish Council meetings, in public at the Village Hall.

The Parish Council meetings at the Village Hall scheduled for the 30th April and 28th May have therefore been cancelled, along with the Annual Parish Meeting which was scheduled for the 16th April. A decision relating to Parish Council Meetings on 25th June and beyond, will be taken nearer the time.

However, Councillors do need to conduct normal Parish Council business, i.e., approving payments, responding to Planning Applications etc, so will continue to convene 'virtual' Parish Council meetings using Skype video conferencing. The Government has issued **The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020, which came into force on 4th April 2020, to support its** Coronavirus (Covid-19) Bill and the following procedure allows the Parish Council to remain legally compliant with the Regulations, through remote attendance using video conferencing.

Agendas will continue to be published on the Cockfield Website and on the Parish Council Notice Board outside the Village Hall, on the Friday prior to the Parish Council meeting (held on the following Thursday). If members of the public are unable to attend the 'virtual' Parish Council Meeting, but wish to raise any issues relating to the agenda, e.g., comments on planning applications, etc, they can forward them (up until the Wednesday before the meeting) to the <u>Clerk via the Parish Council email</u> <u>address</u>, <u>parish.council@cockfield.org.uk</u>, and the Clerk will ensure that they are available to Councillors.

Members of the public can access and participate in the 'virtual' Parish Council meeting on Skype if they have a PC/Laptop/Tablet or Phone and a reasonable Wi-Fi signal, subject to any rules of participation specified by the Chairman at the start of the meeting. Any member of the public wishing to access the meeting should advise the Clerk via the Parish Council email address, parish.council@cockfield.org.uk, up until 5.00pm on the day of the Parish Council meeting and provide him with the email address associated with their IT/phone equipment. The Clerk will then email them a 'Link to the Meeting' and Access Instructions, shortly before the meeting (at approximately 7.15pm). Note: There should not be any need to have Skype pre-loaded on your PC/Laptop/Tablet/Phone, as the Link should enable you to access Skype via any web browsing software.

It is recommended that any member of the public intending to address the Parish Council during the meeting should provide a copy of their question (or report) to the Clerk via the Parish Council email address <u>parish.council@cockfield.org.uk</u>, in advance of the meeting, so that if their access is lost during the meeting (i.e., through a wi-fi failure), then the Chairman will be able to read out their question during the meeting. Update on Housing Development at Mackenzie Place, Cockfield Jeffreys Green

I'm pleased that for my second Green Links article during the Coronavirus pandemic I'm able to update you that the construction site is back open, and work is progressing. Following the release of government guidance and the move to reducing some lockdown restrictions, SEH were able to reopen the site with strict protocols and risk assessments in place around site operations and social distancing measures.

It will take a little time to assess the impact of the shut down and the new ways of working on the construction programme, so we're not yet able to confirm when the first properties will be completed. If the pandemic situation continues to improve, and we don't see any further site closures or problems with obtaining building materials, we hope to provide an update on timescales in the coming weeks.

We have also been able to secure planning permission for three bungalows on behalf of Babergh District Council on land that they own adjacent to the site and accessed by the same access road as the Orwell site. We are currently agreeing costs with SEH and the District Council and hope to be starting work on these bungalows in the summer.

We unfortunately had to cancel the village information event that was planned for April 7th and we will consider how we can hold this in the future as the pandemic situation improves. In the meantime, we are still taking enquiries from people who are interested in the rented, shared ownership or self-build properties and can provide information on the various property types that will be available.

Gardening Tips for June 2020

Flowers & Grasses

- Once the leaves of snowdrops and bluebells have started to go yellow you can lift and divide the clumps.
- Fuchsias Pinch out the tips to promote a bushy habit. This will also encourage the production of more flowers.
- Regularly dead head your repeat flowering roses.
- Once you have hardened off (this means moving plants outdoors for a portion of the day to get them acclimatised to different amounts of light, air and in particular night time temperatures) you should now be able to move hanging baskets and containers out of the greenhouse to their final positions in the garden.
- Don't forget to water hanging baskets and container grown plants either first thing in the morning or in the evening. Depending on the weather you may have to water hanging baskets twice a day. You should also feed with a liquid fertiliser at least once a week.
- Sweet Peas pick as soon as they flower to encourage the plant to produce more blooms.
- Once Oriental poppies have finished flowering cut the foliage back to ground level. They will soon recover and produce a fresh mound of foliage.
- Towards the end of the month you can also invigorate Hardy Geraniums by trimming back to encourage new foliage and flowers. 'Roxanne' is a particularly long flowering variety with bright blue flowers.
- Make sure all tall plants such as Delphiniums, Sunflowers are fully supported. Also stake and tie in Dahlias as they grow.
- Cut back Pulmonarias and feed with a slow release fertilisers. You can also divide congested clumps and replant now.
- Divide and replant primulas, primroses, polyanthus and cowslips.
- Keep on top of weeding your borders.
- Consider Ornamental grasses for dry areas of the garden and for use in containers with summer bedding.
- Harvest lavender flower heads to use in baking and crafting.

Fruit and Vegetables

- Tomatoes Pinch out the side shoots of your tomato plants. Lightly spray the tomato flowers with water this will help the fruit to set. Start to feed once the first truss is setting fruit.
- Plant outdoor tomatoes.
- Harvest salad crops and sow seeds every fortnight to ensure a continuous supply of leaves
- Early potatoes should be ready for harvesting. Nothing quite like home grown potatoes with lashings of butter.
- Plant out runner beans, courgettes, squashes and pumpkins.
- If you haven't done so already make sure you protect soft fruits from the birds and wildlife with appropriate netting.
- If you are growing soft fruits in containers they will benefit from a high potash liquid feed.
- If you grow blueberries in containers make sure you only water with rainwater.
- Once the leaves turn yellow and start to die back on your onion and garlic that's the time to start harvesting.

Trees, Shrubs & Climbers

- Spring flowering shrubs such as Weigela, Deutzia, Kerria, Philadephus and Ribes (flowering currants) which have finished flowering can be pruned back to a healthy bud now.
- Midsummer is a good time to prune back deciduous Magnolias when they are in full leaf.

• Remove any reverted green shoots on evergreen shrubs such as Eleagnus and Euonymus to prevent the whole shrub losing variegation.





• If summer rainfall is scarce then I would delay planting any containerised trees or shrubs until autumn.

Lawns

- You can still apply a lawn fertiliser if you didn't get round to it in May.
- It's a good idea to spike the lawn in hot weather this will enable any rain to penetrate down to the roots.
- If weather has been very dry raise the blades on the mower to reduce stress on the grass.
- During prolonged periods of dry weather water established lawns and especially any newly seeded or turfed lawns.

General Maintenance and planning

- Weeds will be growing at an alarming rate. I try and wander out in to the garden preferably on a daily basis to nip off dandelion and daisy flowers before they have a chance to set seed and takeover completely.
- Don't forget to keep the greenhouse well ventilated and shaded in hot weather. In the evening I use my watering can fixed with a rose to spray the base of the greenhouse with water. This helps deter red spider mite.
- Keep bird baths topped up in hot weather.
- Turn compost heaps every month to keep well aerated.

I really hope that you are all keeping safe and well and taking pleasure and comfort from your gardens.

Windows 10 May 2020 Update

Updates are applied automatically to Windows 10 on a regular basis. These updates usually happen without your being aware, unless on occasion a restart is required, and often address security issues.

Twice a year, usually May and October, Microsoft issue a major release to Windows. These updates are more significant, often include new or modified features and require one or more restarts. Because they are a more significant change they are not applied automatically but require user intervention. These updates can be ignored for a while, in fact it's a good idea not to apply them straightaway while any initial issues are ironed out. But these updates should not be totally ignored and certainly should be applied before the next major update 6 months later.

So to prepare for the May 2020 update, first check that you are currently on the latest version of Windows.

If the Windows version is less than 1909 check the Updates & Security setting to see if an optional update is available. Close the System window, then go back to Start and Settings, then click the last item, Update & Security.

In the screenshot below, although the headline shows the system is up to date, further down it shows that the Optional feature update, 1909, is available. Click the 'download and install now' link to update the system then follow the instructions.

The May 2020 update will be available around the 28th and will take a few weeks to be rolled out worldwide. It's worth waiting for a month or so before installing.

Full details of the release have not yet been announced, but it has been trailed that the release will include a change to the menu system. It seems the large icons – tiles – that have become a familiar part of the Start menu structure, will be abandoned.

Dear Friends,

Today I visited Homebase, it was a joyous occasion as I wheeled my trolley around one of my favourite stores in Bury St Edmunds. I have to confess that I would rather shop in a DIY store than a fashion outlet! I needed some screws for the garden gate which my dog had managed to damage a couple of days ago, and I had to fix it to make it safe. It was lovely to be back in the store, even with social distancing!

It's just one of the things that I have missed during these past couple of months - some way down the list of course, but nevertheless a reminder that our personal freedom has been curtailed in order to try to prevent the spread of Covid -19. What I miss most of all is the company of other people, those that I worship, work and socialise with, as well as my family. For those of us who live alone, this has been the hardest part of lockdown.

But as we prepare to open our schools to pupils, and then our churches (at the time of writing it is thought we may be able to do so at the beginning of July) I can feel the levels of anxiety rising in the community. Of course we are wary, of course we are not sure whether this is the right time, but we will have to trust our government and its advisors, and of course follow the guidance that we are given.

Throughout this period people have been very kind to each other. There have been 'phone calls, social media messages and emails. When out on dog walks there have been conversations at a distance. There have been 'zoom' meetings, and there has been the opportunity to reach out to people in worship via the benefice facebook page.

At the heart of this period for me has been prayer. Prayer has sustained meand many other Christians across the world. Prayer on my own in the Rectory. Prayer with others via video conferencing. Prayer at set times in the day as well as prayer at moments of distress or pain. As well as thankfulness prayers for all that I am lucky to have in this most beautiful part of the world.

For some, the thought of a being that has created and sustained us seems completely ludicrous. How can it be that people in the 21st century can believe in a force, a person, a thing without evidence that he/she/it exists? And even if God does exist, and - as Christians claim - loves us as children, how can it be that God has allowed coronavirus to infiltrate and devastate our society? This is an age old question, and one that can't really be answered in a way that would satisfy most people. One of our lay ministers, Malcolm Gifford, gave me a book by John C Lennox which is entitled, 'Where is God in a coronavirus world?' It is a very short book of 62 pages, but I think it is very good at helping us to understand what God is really like, and where God is in the midst of all the pain and suffering that coronavirus has brought about.

What I have always known as a Christian is that God loves us very deeply, and will not force us to love Him. He created us in his image, and wants us to have life in all its fullness. Which means enjoying life, every second, every minute, every hour of every day. What I think this crisis has given many is an opportunity to slow down, to think and reflect about the lives that they have been living up to now. And it may have prompted them to make changes.

And so, whether you believe in God or not, I hope that you have had the opportunity to think about life, what you value, and what you can do without. I know I certainly have. And as we go forward into the future, may your resolutions to do things differently, if you've made them, work out well.

None of us may be going abroad for some time, but even in the UK, taking care in the sun is just as much an issue for our health.

Although sunlight is a great source of vitamin D, which is essential for good health, damage to your skin from the sun is a real risk. We can all enjoy the great outdoors, but it's important to take some precautions, especially on hot, sunny days when the sun's harmful rays can cause lasting damage. Over next two months this article will explore the most up to date advice on sunscreens and sun safety to ease us into the summer months.

What is a tan?

The pigment that gives the skin its natural colour is called melanin. Melanin is made in the skin by pigment cells called melanocytes. After our skin has been exposed to sunlight the melanocytes produce more melanin in attempt to absorb further UV radiation, and so the skin becomes darker.



Is a tan ever safe?

Nobody wants to spend the entire summer indoors, and indeed some sunshine can be good for us, helping the body to create vitamin D and giving many of us a feeling of general wellbeing. However, it's all too easy to over-do our sun exposure which can lead to a range of skin problems, the most serious of which include skin cancer. Other summertime skin problems include sunburn, photosensitive rashes and prickly heat. In addition, sun exposure can worsen already existing conditions like rosacea.

While many people associate a tan with looking healthy, a tan is actually a sign that our skin has been harmed by UV radiation and is trying to defend itself against further damage. This kind of damage can in turn increase your risk of developing skin cancer:

Sunburn in particular, is not good for skin health and should be avoided. Children are more susceptible to sunburn, so extra care should be taken to protect them.

More than 100,000 new cases of skin cancer are diagnosed annually in the UK, and while the disease can also occur on parts of the body not exposed to sunlight, extensive sun exposure is thought to be responsible for the vast majority of cases. In more than four out of five cases skin cancer is a preventable disease.

A for Aging B for BURN

UV radiation from the sun is transmitted in three wavelengths – UVA, UVB and UVC. UVC does not penetrate the earth's atmosphere, so we only really need to protect against UVA and UVB.

UV irradiation in the form of UVA is associated with skin ageing. UVA affects the elastin in the skin and leads to wrinkles and sun-induced skin ageing (for example coarse wrinkles, leathery skin and brown pigmentation), as well as skin cancer. UVA can penetrate window glass and penetrates the skin more deeply than UVB. UVA protection in a sunscreen will help defend the skin against photo ageing and potentially skin cancer. UVB is the form of UV irradiation most responsible for sunburn and has strong links to malignant melanoma and basal cell carcinoma risk (types of skin cancer). A sunscreen with a high SPF (sun protection factor) will help block UVB rays and prevent the skin from burning, and by extension damage that can cause skin cancer.

Interestingly, UVB rays do not generally penetrate through glass, so no amount of sitting by the window will give you a tan, but only serve to increase the wrinkles!

How do sunscreens work?

There is a bewildering selection of sunscreen products available, so the best one to choose is not always easy. Some brands will state that they are organic, while others are inorganic, these terms can be quite misleading. Do we actually know what the differences are between them? And which one will be the best choice? The key point is that these words have technical meanings when it comes to sunscreens that have nothing to do with their use in describing food. A 'organic' sunscreen isn't "more natural", nor does it "contains fewer chemicals".

'Organic' is a term used to describe molecules that contain carbon atoms. So sunscreens are organic if their active ingredients contain carbon-based molecules and they generally work by absorbing UV rays from the sun.

The active ingredients in "inorganic sunscreens", such as titanium dioxide or zinc oxide, do not contain carbon atoms, and they work by reflecting UV rays.

In reality, most current brands are a mix of the two types and both can help to prevent sunburn – they just work in different ways. Using sunscreens correctly of either type will have the biggest impact on reducing the risk of skin cancer.


