# TIER TWO RULES

# Help stop the spread of COVID-19



Households are **not** allowed to mix with other people indoors, unless with people in your support bubble.

You can meet with up to **5 other people**, maximum of 6 including yourself, **outside** as long as everyone stays 2 metres apart.



Schools, universities and colleges remain open.

Everyone who can work from home should do so.

Children can move between homes if their parents are separated.



Pubs and bars must close, unless operating as restaurants. Alcohol can only be served with substantial meals. Venues must stop taking orders at 10pm, and close at 11pm.

Retail, indoor leisure, entertainment, personal care, and accommodation settings are **open**.



Whenever you are out of your home, remember 'Hands. Face. Space': Hands – wash your hands regularly and for 20 seconds

**Face** – wear a face covering over nose and mouth in indoor settings **Space** – stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible.



Get tested if you have symptoms: a high temperature; a new continuous cough; a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell and taste.

If you are anyone in you have been in close contact with has symptoms, follow the guidance on self-isolation.



**Travel:** You must follow tier 2 rules when you travel to a tier 1 area. Avoid travel to, or overnight stays, in tier 3 areas other than where necessary, e.g. work, education, medical treatment, or caring responsibilities.

You can travel through a tier 3 area as a part of a longer journey.

#### Census 2021

## will provide a snapshot of modern society

Households across Cockfield will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed," lain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

"This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them."

Census day will be on March 21, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March.

The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.

#### Dear Neighbour

Just like the Covid-19 virus, criminals are targeting the vulnerable. Since the outbreak, there has been an increase in cybercrime and fraud. 'You wouldn't leave your front door open when you leave your house for criminals to walk right in. Having weak passwords is like leaving your digital front door open for cybercriminals to steal all your personal data and images.' So, protect yourself with strong Pa\$\$W0rDs (not like this), have a separate password for



your email account and protect your devices with antivirus software. If you would like more information about Passwords, Phishing, Online ID, Updates, Wi-Fi, Online shopping, Payment, Romance, or Impersonation fraud, go to <a href="https://www.met.police.uk/littlemedia">https://www.met.police.uk/littlemedia</a> for a series of short informative videos. To report any fraud or cyber crime phone ActionFraud on 0300 123 2040 or call CrimeStoppers COVID Fraud Hotline on 0800 587 5030.

Criminals have been targeting people selling items online, by sending them emails purporting to be from PayPal. The emails trick victims into believing they have received payment for the items they are selling. Typically, after receiving these emails, victims will ship the item to the criminal, without receiving any payment. Do not be persuaded into sending anything until you can verify you have received the payment. Note, a genuine PayPal email will address you by your first and last name and will never ask you for your password, bank account, or credit card details in the message.

This autumn you probably saw the reports of over 1,000 arrests, half a million pounds in cash recovered and millions of pounds worth of County Line illegal drugs seized. Each 'County Line' is the mobile phone line, typically taking over £25,000 per week in orders for drugs, which are transported from one area to another, usually by vulnerable young people, who are coerced into it by gangs. Threats of violence, mental and sexual abuse and drug dependency ensure the loyalty of these young drug runners, leaving the dealers with the hope that they will stay under the radar of law enforcement. If you suspect County Lines within the community report it to the police (101 or in an emergency 999) or, if you wish to remain anonymous, via CrimeStoppers (0800 555111).

In the last 250 days approximately 60,000 people have sadly died in the UK of Covid-19 within 28 days of a positive test. That is 200 each day. Every 20 minutes, someone is killed or seriously injured on a British road. That is over 70 each day. Each crash is a tragedy, each crash is preventable, so on these darker winter days do take special care when walking, cycling, and driving.

Finally, as many people set up temporary home offices and adjust to a new ways of working during the pandemic, the fire service is warning of a rise in electrical fires. So please check that your home has working smoke alarms. Do not charge electrical items on flammable surfaces like beds, and do not get distracted by emails or work calls and leave your cooker hob on and unattended at meal-times.

Remember 'crime cannot flourish in a community that cares', so be on the alert and be watchful in looking after yourself and your neighbours.

# Self-isolation support payments for low-income earners in Babergh



Residents on low-incomes and unable to work because they have been asked to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace, can now claim a £500 payment to compensate for loss of earnings.

As part of a nationwide Government scheme, residents in Babergh who are on low incomes and are unable to work because they have been told by NHS Test and Trace that they have to self-isolate can now apply for a lump sum payment from their local councils. Money will be paid into their accounts within days of their applications being verified, to relieve immediate financial hardship.

People who receive notification from NHS Test and Trace to self-isolate because they have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, will be entitled to a £500 support payment if they meet all of the following requirements:

- They comply with the NHS Test and Trace notification to self-isolate
- are employed or self-employed
- are unable to work from home and will lose income as a result

#### AND are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

Universal Credit - Working Tax Credit - Income-based Employment and Support Allowance - Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance Income Support - Housing Benefit - Pension Credit

Discretionary payments may also be available in exceptional circumstances to individuals who meet the main qualifying criteria (i.e. low-income and unable to work because they are self-isolating) but are not in receipt of qualifying benefits and are facing severe financial hardship.

The scheme is being administered on behalf of the local authority by the Shared Revenue Partnership - with a fast and simple application form now available on the councils' websites together with information about how to easily provide evidence required and further details about the scheme.

Claims must be made within 14 days of a period of self-isolation ending. Residents are also reminded of the launch of the Suffolk Support and Advice Service earlier this month to help people access information or support relating to debt, benefits, housing or employment.

Citizens Advice Suffolk Alliance, which includes the eight Citizens Advice Bureaus across Suffolk, and Anglia Care Trust and Ipswich Housing Action Group are delivering advice and support to people through a single phone line. The phoneline is funded by Suffolk Public Sector Leaders and has been developed by Suffolk-wide partners on the Collaborative Communities Covid-19 Board, which is part of the Suffolk Resilience Forum.

We may be lucky enough to see some more snow this month - what fun! Here are some ideas of what you can do in the snow or when its very cold - with parents approval of course!

#### Blow unpoppable bubbles

The soapy solution you use in summer reacts differently in chilly temperatures. Leave the bubble bottle outside so it can get really cold. Then wave the wand—instead of blowing with your warm breath—to let the bubbles fly. If you're quick (and careful) enough to catch one, you might just see it slowly ice over in your hands.

#### Take a nature walk

Identify the animal footprints you see. A symmetrical track with four toes, large claws, and a small heel pad probably came from a canine (think a dog or a fox), while asymmetrical tracks with four toes, a relatively large heel pad, and no claws may indicate a feline (like a house cat). Two-toed, heart-shaped tracks usually signal deer. Or, you can find a cosy spot to quietly watch and listen for birds.

#### Toss snowballs.

Have a snowball-throwing contest! Make a target by creating a bright circle in the snow with coloured water in a squirt bottle. You can also paint a bull's-eye target on a piece of cardboard, giving each coloured ring a point value. Attach it to a tree, and keep score as you try to hit the target with snowballs.

The Cinema will operate under the following special conditions, always with the caveat that things may need to change between now and screening day:

- To comply with social distancing and government guidelines for such public premises, and for the particular set up in the village hall, a maximum of 30 cinemagoers will be admitted.
- Seating will be set out according to social distancing and to cater for couples, singles and where possible family groups of 3 or 4. Chairs must not be moved by attendees.
- A one-way system for access, exit and use of toilets will be in force and indicated by signs.

Hand sanitiser will be available at the entrance and in the hall

Face covering must be worn whilst in the hall

Ice cream will be offered, £1.50 per tub

Attendees may bring their own teas, coffees, other drinks, mugs, glasses etc. All materials and litter must be taken away again at the end

There will not be a raffle and the interval will be shorter than usual

Once the screening is over attendees will be asked to leave the building via the marked exits and not gather for conversations.

Chairs will be stacked away by designated people. Attendees are asked not to help out.

#### **Booking & Tickets**

Admittance will be by advanced reservation only. No walk-ins will be permitted.

We will not issue tickets but use the reservation system for confirmation on the day

- To reserve up to 4 places, please email <a href="mailto:cinema.tickets@cockfield.org.uk">cinema.tickets@cockfield.org.uk</a>, or phone Julie Goodsman 07815 497952 weekdays after 3pm or anytime weekends, or Neil Ashton 07900 880888 any time. Confirmation of your reservation will be issued.
- To assist with the seating plan on the day, if reserving 2-4 places you will be asked for the number of family units i.e. who are not socially distancing amongst themselves.
- For contact tracing, at the time of reserving, the person booking will be asked for a contact email address or phone number (In line with government guidelines this information will be retained for 21 days).

Payment will be collected on arrival; exact money is requested.

Please contact one of the above if you have reserved places but cannot attend, so that the places can be reallocated.

The Cinema procedures follow prevailing government instructions and guidelines, and additional guidance provided by Community Action Suffolk (ACRE). This year, we are expecting more people to need our help than ever before, so we are merging the Surviving Winter Appeal with the central Rebuilding Local Lives initiative that we have been running since the start of the pandemic. We hope that this action will deliver a much louder and easily understood central message to increase local giving and ensure that every vulnerable person in our 'Caring County' is supported to 'Stay Warm, Stay Well and Stay Connected'.

As the Coronavirus pandemic continues to have a profound impact on all our lives, we perhaps have a greater empathy than ever before of what it is to feel vulnerable, lonely or isolated.

At this time of year, for the team at the Foundation and all our annual Surviving Winter Appeal partners and existing donors, thoughts inevitably turn to the coming months and the impact that shorter days and colder nights may have on the health and wellbeing, particularly of vulnerable older people and others experiencing deprivation or serious issues affecting their physical or mental health.

With winter almost upon us, Suffolk is bracing itself for a dramatic increase in need. Last year our annual Surviving Winter Appeal raised enough money to heat over 1000 homes and connected many hundreds of people to other services to help tackle isolation, address physical and mental health challenges, improve poor living conditions, solve debt problems and assist with access to services to help them stay safe and well.



### **Great Green Adventure Playground**

I am sure you will have noticed that the new adventure playground is taking shape on the Green. Unfortunately, our contractor has been impacted by Covid restrictions and difficulties with his scheduling and resources, therefore the work has taken far longer than we originally anticipated. However, progress is being made and will soon be at a conclusion, although the situation remains fluid with the lockdown. Nevertheless, when completed hopefully in early December, the equipment will be available for use. We continue to liaise with the contractor and will monitor government directives that influence this.

We are not yet sure how we can facilitate an official opening event to celebrate the efforts put into securing funding, getting the project underway and finished. I would like to thank all those involved in what has turned out to be a challenging period.

The Parish Council does remind users that at the time of writing; From Thursday 5 November national COVID-19 restrictions apply to England, although this allows that outdoor playgrounds can remain open.

In general, you must not meet with another person socially or undertake any activities with another person. However, you can exercise or meet in a public outdoor space with people you live with, your support bubble (or as part of a childcare bubble), or with one other person.

You should minimise time spent outside your home. When around other people, stay 2 metres apart from anyone not in your household - meaning the people you live with - or your support bubble. Where this is not possible, stay 1 metre apart with extra precautions (e.g. wearing a face covering).

The Parish Council are not able to micromanage, provide direct supervision at the playground, or implement a continuous cleaning regime. We ask all users to consider their own wellbeing and that of others during the use of the equipment and note following:

We remind users, parents, guardians and carers of the need for social distancing.

We strongly recommend the wearing of face coverings. Current government guidance states that face coverings should not be used by children under the age of 3 or those who may find it difficult to manage them correctly. Parents should be aware that wearing a face covering in a playground setting could pose an additional safety risk and should use their judgement on whether their children wear a face covering.

Users are to dispose of used face coverings by taking them home for disposal.

Cleaning of equipment by users, parents, guardians and carers, particularly where there are clear touch points such as swing rockers and see-saws will improve the safety of all users.

We encourage parents to bring hand sanitiser gel or wipes to clean their children's hands.

We encourage hand hygiene with including washing/sanitising hands more often than usual, for 20 seconds using soap and water or approved gel and foam sanitiser, particularly at the beginning and end of play.

We remind the children not to put their mouths on equipment or their hands in their mouths and not to touch their faces.

The consumption of food or drink on play equipment or in the playground area is banned due to the risk associated with transmission.

# Summary report of the Ordinary Parish Council meeting held on held on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2020 held by Skype Video Conference

The Chairman welcomed Andrew Golding to the Council who had been coopted

**Cutting Grass alongside footpaths:** 

Suffolk County Cllr Lindsay advised he has now secured some commitment to progress this from Highways.

Noticeboards: A quotation from C Limmer was accepted to refurbish the existing noticeboard at Cross Green.

Maintenance Schedule: Cllr Levett and the Clerk to finalise the Maintenance Schedule to facilitate preparation of the 2021/22 Annual budget & Precept.

New SID: Cllr Turner was awaiting quotations for a new SID and 3 No. new support posts.

Suffolk County Councillor: Robert Linsey was not in attendance however, had provided a written report.

#### **Babergh District Councillors:**

Cllr Mayberry had offered a written report, on 06.11.20, in advance of the meeting.

This included a reminder of the minor adaptions grant available from BDC for a maximum of £7,500 to fund adaptions to homes that would make it much easier for those with accessibility issues or a vulnerable status. These adaptions can be anything from a key safe to the exterior of the property, to a walk-in shower in a bathroom. These grants are not means tested and can be for both a private or privately tenanted property.

Cllr Arthey had provided an update / reminder on recyclables, via a separate leaflet, confirming what could be placed in blue bins.

Babergh District Council planning permissions/refusals received: DC/20/04312: Application for Listed Building Consent - Replacement of damaged main bedroom ceiling. Stows Hill House, Stows Hill, Cockfield, Bury St Edmunds Suffolk IP30 OJB. Decision: Listed Building Consent has been Granted.

DC/20/04184: Discharge of Conditions Application for DC/19/04576 - Condition 6 (Archaeological Written Scheme of Investigation). Site Adjacent To, Mackenzie Place, Cockfield, Suffolk. Decision: Approved Conditions.

DC/20/04060: Planning Application - Erection of 1no. self-build dwelling and associated works. Land Adjacent to Gambrel, Chapel Road, Cockfield, Suffolk: Notice of Withdrawn Application.

DC/20/04006: Full Application - Conversion of kennel block to single-storey dwelling, including erection of porch and chimney and construction of link between kennel buildings. Erection of double garage & storeroom, following removal of existing cattery, sheds and outbuildings, approved following appeal reference APP/D3505/W/17/3170002, amended scheme to include extension. Roundwood House, Windsor Green, Cockfield, Bury St Edmunds Suffolk IP30 OLY. Decision: Planning Permission has been Granted.

Finance: The clerk noted that the budget setting meeting would need to be delayed as BMSDC still had not issued the 2021/22 Precept forms or the

Tax Base which is needed to calculate the PC Element of the Council Tax, along with providing the baseline for calculating our annual % reduction/increase in our Precept demand. Due to the considerable work needed in preparing the budget documentation the Clerk was asked to proceed and make assumptions pending further confirmation from BMSDC.



Glebe Land: Cllr's Morley and Webster were attending the virtual Allotment help and advice sessions being held by BMSDC.

Cemetery: Autumn work in tidying up had been undertaken.

Playground: The playground work is nearing completion and the contractor would submit the independent safety inspection report on completion. The chairman noted that the budget setting meeting should make provision for a maintenance contract for the new equipment. The Clerk would investigate the contractor used by SCC Vertas and obtain a quotation.

Parish Paths: It was noted that a footbridge on the path at Small Bridge was in need of repair. Cllr Turner would investigate and report to SCC.

Pavilion Update: The working group would meet 29.11.20 to agree the colour scheme for the remediation works decoration and flooring.

Local Needs Housing: Despite recent bad weather the Councillors noted good progress with works, adjacent to the road, was now occurring. Further updates would be posted in Green Links.

Neighbourhood CIL: The CIL working group had looked at options for a replacement bus shelter a Mackenzie Place. Some examples were reviewed although the site may require a bespoke solution, so a contractor would be asked to attend to give advice and offer quotations.

Suffolk Association of Local Councils (SALC): Cllr Cutting-Keyton noted that the recent virtual meeting "Suffolk Police forum - Anti-social behaviour" was informative . It was noted our SNT contact is Inspector Kevin Horton, who should be able to assist.

Highways and Emergencies: Potholes and highway matters continued to be reported on the SCC website.

Police/Fire: Cllr Cutting-Keyton advised that obtaining advice on antisocial behaviour was still difficult and disappointing. There had been no positive response to our email of 19.11.20. Cllr Mayberry suggested escalation to

the Police and Crime Commissioner due to this poor response.

Mackenzie Open Space Meadow: Repair works to the Bruffs line vehicle bridge would await the completion of our CIL funding bid.

Village Minibus: The working group were to meet before the next PC meeting to consider options for the management and future direction of the minibus.

Correspondence: BMSDC had advised that the Developer for the development behind the Plough and Fleece had selected a name for the road as "Willow Mews". The Parish Council were invited to comment. The name was considered not the most appropriate and, in any event, could lead to confusion with the Willow Bridge area. Cllr Morley was asked to research a suitable alternative name with a local historic association.

#### January's Advice Page

I'm a bit concerned about buying goods online. What happens if something goes wrong, or if I change my mind after seeing something in reality? I don't have money to lose right now.

You're not alone being cautious about shopping online. Over the last year Citizens Advice Consumer Service has dealt with just under 123,000 cases in relation to online shopping.

Most of the time, when you buy something online you automatically get a 14-day 'cooling-off period' which starts the day after you receive your order. There doesn't need to be anything wrong with the item for you to get a refund. Many online sellers may offer more time, so make sure you check the terms and conditions before purchasing.

There are some exceptions, like buying something bespoke or perishable, like flowers or chocolates. There are also exceptions if the product is sealed, like face masks or CDs.

If you do decide to return your item, you need to tell the seller you don't want the item within 14 days of receiving it. Once you've told the seller, you've got 14 days to send it back. The seller has to pay you the refund within 14 days from when they receive the item.

You may have to pay the cost of posting something back to the seller, but you don't have to return the item in its original packaging as long as you've wrapped it safely. If you don't wrap it safely and the item gets damaged, the seller can reduce your refund.

It's a good idea to get a certificate of posting from Royal Mail when you post the item. You can use this to prove to the seller that you posted the item.

If you buy something online and the product is faulty (i.e. it's broken, unusable or doesn't match what was advertised), you have 30 days to ask for a refund from when you receive it. However, you can choose to accept a replacement or repair. After 30 days (and before six months) the seller must offer you a repair within a reasonable timeframe. If this isn't possible, they must offer you a replacement or a refund. Ask the seller for the easiest way to send the item back. You shouldn't have to pay.

If you order something and it doesn't arrive, it's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered to you. If the seller used a courier, they should chase the courier to find out what's happened to your order - it's not your responsibility.

Check the delivery address you gave the seller. Then contact them and ask where your order is. If the seller claims they've delivered it or don't know where it is, you can ask for a redelivery. You might also be able to get a refund in some circumstances.

# computer Corner

#### Dealing with iPad / iPhone Images in Windows

If someone sends you an email from an iPhone or iPad which includes images, as well as the image files there may be some strange looking files with names such as ATT00001.txt.

Here's how multiple images from an iPhone appear as attachments to an email in my Outlook email program:



Other emails systems will look different, but the treatment of attachments will be similar. This behaviour is all to do with the way Windows deals with embedded images. The originator of the email may have inserted an image then added some words to go with the image, then a 2<sup>nd</sup> image and more accompanying words and so on. Windows creates a file for the image, then creates a file of the text that follows, then another file from the next image, the next block of text and so on.

So the files ATT00001.txt are simple text files containing any text that sits between the images. That text might be nothing more than a couple of new lines, or it might be several paragraphs of description to accompany an image. So if a friend sends you such an email, don't assume the files ATT00001.txt are unimportant – they are in effect the text part of the email. All the files attached to the email can be saved in your file system in the usual way. Double click on the ATT files and they will open up in a text editor, e.g. Notepad, or your word processor. From there you'll know if the content is important.

Often the final file will just contain something like Sent from my iPhone. The point is, don't ignore these files.

#### **Apple Earphones and Windows**

Did you know you can use Apple wireless earphones such as the earbuds with Windows? To set up the phones, go to Start / Settings / Devices. At the top of the main right-hand panel, make sure the Bluetooth setting is on then click Add Bluetooth or other device. On the next screen you can pair the headphones with your computer — press the small button on the case of the earbuds (with the earbuds in the case) and the pairing will be set up.

As the New Year starts it is sometimes good to look aback and reflect on what went before, for 'old' readers of Green Links the stories of Ken Steward will be familiar to you, sadly Ken is no longer with us but I hope you will enjoy an occasional reprint of his tales.

#### The Old Stubble Fowl Hut.

There was a stubble fowl hut on about every farm in Suffolk, and no doubt every county in the British Isles in circa 1922 and indeed much later, in fact until the combine harvester replaced the self binder and little 'shaled' grain was to be found among the stubble on almost all fields; that is of course if the settings of the combine was according to makers specification.

What was so special about a stubble hut? First it was usually mobile, had wheels, and sometimes shafts so that a horse could be used to move it once a field of wheat or barley had been bindered and stoked, and then perhaps move the hut at weekly periods to a fresh patch of field.

Such a hut would hold up to perhaps 40 laying hens depending on it's size; fitted with say 4 rows of perches enabling say 40 birds to perch. These huts always had a row of nesting boxes enabling eggs to be laid comfortably and remain clean for the daily collection by the farmer's wife or children.

Why the farmer's wife? Good question, eggs and poultry were perhaps the main income for the farmer's wife in those earlier days; hence this good woman defended with extraordinary care this 'right' and lost no opportunity of increasing numbers and saving food. No quality grain would be allowed for fowls, only the tail corn or screenings, thus once harvest commenced the foul hut was very soon moved into the field and quickly the number of eggs increased; as did the farmer's wife's remuneration.

Another important aspect, part of each stubble hut was the presence of a hinged ramp covering an exit to allow hens to be safely enclosed at dark, and released again in the morning after sun rise. Why this device: one wonders, one word Foxes!

Hunting with hounds was a popular sport and hunting the fox meant foxes were usually present around farm fields, and Reynard enjoyed nothing more than to raid the hen hut and kill perhaps 15 or 20 birds, bury one or two nearby and carry one away to its den for food for his or her family of cubs. A suckling vixen was perhaps the greatest plague of fowls on the farm when I was a boy. After perhaps the age of 8 or 9 years my last job in the evening was to shut the hens up safely. I remember on one occasion I forgot (perhaps on purpose) not to shut the ramp up securely. I still remember the soreness of my hind part the following morning, of course Mr Fox had been, the hens were of course able to range from first light. Our horseman Bill Taylor, was instructed me and use his belt vigorously. This he did, he was ex first War and could run harder than I could. As years went by the running order changed!

Life on a hundred acre farm in the twenties and thirties of the twentieth century was so different, schools taught the three R's and we learned then I assure you. No one answered back, most families had mother and father and almost all had enough to eat, almost all had a vegetable garden or 40 rods of allotment, thus good food was available if one worked.

Sorry, I have let my mind go back to early childhood, back to the stubble hut, I have the hut of my childhood still here at Hope House Farm, a three wheeled model with shafts to allow a horse to move it as required. This hut was built by my father in 1922, when he and my mother were the tenants at Sutton Hall Farm, Bradfield Combust.

In 1924 the hut was moved to Block Farm Bradfield Combust and in 1940 the dear old hut came to Hope House, where it is still mobile, but in need of small repairs, which are planned to be carried out 'before long'.

This old hen hut, whilst under construction some 82 years ago, was the fixing point, by small 'dog lead', for my elder sister Jean; the story goes that this rather talkative child, to give my mother a 'break' was attached to the front wheel of the hut. So I have been told! My sister still says she does not remember!



### **Congregational Church Corner**

Murphey's Law is a well-known idea stating that if something can go wrong it will do so and if it does go wrong then it will do so at the worst possible time. Where this concept came from nobody knows for sure but the front runner seems to be that it came from Captain Edward Murphy, an engineer, who became angry with his assistant for wrongly wiring a transducer, that Murphy was trying to develop, and so Murphy said of him: "If he can do anything the wrong way he will do it". Over time, with some modifications, this became known as the Murphy's Law that we know today.

Murphy's Law has been around for a long time and is widely used by people when things go wrong for them but its negativity contrasts with the positivity of God's law which assures us that: "All things work together for good to them who love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). And the reason for this is found in the very next verse: "For whom He did foreknow He also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son".

What a comfort this should be to believers because it tells us that God not only knew us from before the beginning of time but also that He was determined to shape us into the image of His son, whom He loves and with whom He is well pleased (2 Peter 1:17). To underline this He tells each believer: "I have loved thee with an everlasting love; therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee" (Jeremiah 31:3).

All of this teaches us to be confident, that whatever happens in our lives, especially at the start of the New Year, God has our best interests at heart and so instead of looking for the reasons why things are going "wrong", we should be looking for what God is trying to show us and teach us and then, as we seek His will and do it, this will redound for our eternal benefit and glory (Romans 8:18).

At all times we should remember that God is love (1 John 4:8) and everything He does is and can only be motivated by this characteristic. It is in His very nature to be loving and kind and He cannot do anything that would be contrary to this. It naturally follows, therefore, that everything He puts or permits into our lives is done because He loves and cares for us (1 Peter 5:7).
