#### Self Build Plots - More Details

As part of the first phase of construction at Jeffreys Green, Orwell has provided the services, connections and main roads to serve four plots of land upon which individual homes can be built.

The plots have outline planning permission for detached houses and are offered for sale by Suffolk County Council to people who would like to have the exciting opportunity to build or procure their own home in the village.

Sales will be conditional on the buyers living in the house themselves for a specified number of years and Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) will not be payable if the houses remain occupied by the original buyer for 7 years.

Suffolk County Council have appointed Fenn Wright as marketing agents for the plots and bids will be assessed based on an agreed weighted system which benefits people with a connection to Cockfield or surrounding parishes. This means that, whilst the plots will be marketed on the open market, bids received will be weighted higher if defined local connection criteria are met by the bidder.

## Cockfield Parish Council Notes



Summary Report of the Extraordinary Meeting of the full Council held on 21 December 2021

The Parish Council do not ordinarily hold meetings during December due to the Christmas holidays. However, urgent items of business required to be actioned particularly limited by the timescale associated with the Plough and Fleece matters, therefore an extraordinary meeting was called.

#### Plough and Fleece – ACV Community Right to Bid

Cllr Southgate outlined the history of the ACV process relating to the pub, the timescales involved in the Community Right to Bid process and the opportunities for and concerns of the Parish Council.

The Cockfield Village Group (a Community Interest Group) advised that they had expressed an interest with BMSDC to be considered as a bidder. However they still needed to register themselves as a Company Limited by Guarantee by 10/01/22, to be considered as an eligible Community Interest Group and trigger the Full Moratorium period. They had undertaken preliminary discussions with the owner and were now aware of the asking price and the assets being offered for sale. They outlined their ambition to create a Community Hub on the site by incorporating a coffee shop, post office and village shop with the pub.

The Chair of the Community Council advised that if the Cockfield Village Group were unable to achieve the above within the timescales, he was willing to convene a meeting of Trustees to explore opportunities for the Community Council to do so.

It was proposed by Cllr Southgate and seconded by Cllr Cutting-Keyton that the Parish Council should support any group with viable proposals to save the pub, but that the Parish Council could themselves never be in a position to submit a Bid or indeed be considered as a Bidder, thus precluding them from Expressing an Interest to do so. The proposal was carried.

The Parish Council agreed to forward a letter to the Cockfield Village Group

expressing its support for them to become an eligible Bidder, which could be forwarded to BMSDC.

#### Decision: Amendment Detail Has Been Approved

**Pavilion Air Conditioning System Repairs:** It was agreed to implement repairs to the pavilion heat pump system following a call out inspection by a new specialist contractor.

Subsequently the new contractor was found to be more competitive than the existing provider, so it was also agreed to sanction transfer of the maintenance contract for the next year.

**Neighbourhood CIL:** In Cllr Morley's absence, the Clerk advised the Street Furniture Licence for the new Mackenzie Place bus shelter had been obtained. SEH French had provided a quotation to design the groundworks for the Bus Shelter. A meeting with SEH French has been scheduled for 21/01/22 to fully discuss proposals, timescales and any need for a S278 application.

#### Garden Tips for February 2022

#### Flowers & Grasses

Herbaceous Perennials – Weather permitting take the opportunity to clear last year's dead flower heads and foliage. New growth should be visible at the base of the plant. You can also divide congested clumps to improve vigour and make new plants for free. Top dress established borders with proprietary fertiliser such as blood, fish and bone or well-rotted manure.

Remove old foliage from Epimediums before the spring flowers start to develop.

Divide large clumps of bulbs such as snowdrops and winter aconites after flowering then re-plant to establish new colonies.

Cut back deciduous grasses (e.g. Pennisetum, Miscanthus) which were left uncut over the winter. With regard to evergreen grasses (e.g. Carex, Stipa) you just need to remove the dead grass.

Continue removing faded flowers from winter pansies and violas to prevent the plants setting seed. This will encourage the plants to produce fresh flushes of flower when the weather warms up.





Trim back winter flowering heathers to prevent them growing leggy.

Remove leaves with brown/blackish spots on Hellebores (Christmas rose) by doing this you will reveal the true beauty of these early winter flowers. Do not add the leaves to the compost heap as this will spread disease.

Trim back Ivy, Virginia creeper if they have outgrown their space and most importantly before the birds have started nesting.

Sweet peas seeds can now be sown in deep pots/ root trainers. Keep them in a frost-free greenhouse or a sunny windowsill. If you have autumn sown Sweet peas now is the time to pot on and pinch out. This will encourage side shoots to form.

#### Fruit and Vegetables

Clear weeds from vegetable seed beds and fork in compost or well-rotted manure. Sow some vegetable seeds in greenhouse borders, cold frames or under cloches. Try sowing Aubergine, salad leaves, tomatoes, leeks, celeriac and onions.

Broad beans can be sown outside providing the soil isn't frozen or waterlogged. Chit first early potato tubers – by arranging the tubers in shallow trays or egg boxes with the eyes (young shoots) uppermost. Put in a light frost proof shed or room to encourage the tubers to sprout. Cut autumn fruiting raspberry canes down to the ground.

Prune back blackcurrant, redcurrants and gooseberries to a good open framework. Top dress fruit bushes with a slow release fertiliser (potassium-rich) to feed plants during the new growing season.

Put fleece or cloches over strawberry plants to start them into growth. This will encourage early cropping.

Last chance to winter prune apple and pear trees while they are still dormant. You should aim to take out a bit of old wood each winter to stimulate new growth. Avoid the haircut approach and try to stagger the pruning cuts throughout the canopy. Your aim should be to create an open centre to the tree which will allow more light to ripen shoots and produce fruit. It will also allow good air movement which help prevent disease.



Plant Rhubarb into enriched soil (well - rotted manure added) or split and divide established crowns.

#### Trees, Shrubs & Climbers

Prune winter flowering shrubs (Mahonia, Forsythia and winter flowering Jasmine) once they have finished flowering.

Prune Buddleias back hard to keep this vigorous shrub to a reasonable size. This will ensure that the flowers and scent can be fully enjoyed.

Complete winter pruning of Wisteria by cutting summer side shoots to 2 or 3 buds.

Prune hardy evergreen hedges and tidy deciduous hedges towards the end February and early March before birds start nesting.

Prune back clematis which flower in summer (July onwards) to 12 inches from the ground. Do not prune Clematis Montana or any of the early flowering (Jan – May) Alpina, Armandii species. These should only be are immediately after they have finished flowering.



Roses – Complete planting of new roses but not if the ground is wet and sticky or if there is frost or snow on the surface of the ground. If conditions unsuitable then just heel the plants into a nursery bed as a temporary measure.

Prune Hybrid Tea and Floribunda roses mid Feb to early March before growth restarts. Remember the 3 D'S – Remove dead, damaged and diseased growth.





Sprinkle slow-release fertiliser around the base of roses and flowering shrubs.

#### General Maintenance and planning

Check your garden tools are clean and sharp. Check and service garden machinery so that you are fully prepared for the forthcoming season.

Wash greenhouse glazing inside and out to allow as much light in as possible.

Think about, plan and order any plug plants.

Create a box with dividers for each month. Sort out seed packets and arrange in sowing date order.

Clean empty pots with mild washing up liquid. Rinse thoroughly and allow to dry. Get on top of perennial weeds whilst easier to control.

Editors Note;

Thank you Kate for guiding us through our gardening year, it's really good to have your help and advice back for 2022.

### Weather 2021

#### January.

Mostly dull, cloudy, cold, frosty but some spectacular sunrises usually followed by dull days. The sun was mainly conspicuous by its absence. Key features.

Storm Christoph arrived on 20th but we missed its full force.

Light snow showers on 16th, 23rd and slushy wet snow a week later on 30th.

Hardest frost of winter 25th.

Relatively dry up to 13/14th with 29mm over those two days. A wet end to the month, the last 6 days saw only one rainless day and, in this period 52mm of rain was recorded.

Personally, I was glad to see the back of January.

130mm for the whole month, being the wettest January since I started recording rainfall in 2015. The previous high being in 2016 at just over 77mm.

#### February.

Literally, the month was a Jekyll and Hyde scenario.

Up to the 14th it was Mr Hyde's turn to provide the cold, wet and snowy conditions with approx. 72% of precipitation in this period and snow falling on 6th, 7th and 10th that remained on the ground for just over a week (Storm Darcy brought in strong moist easterly winds). Dr Jekyll presented us with unusually mild and brighter weather from 15th onwards until month's end. Sunny days were enjoyed, cooler in any breeze but feeling Spring like in sheltered spots. Warm enough for our first butterfly spotting of the year on 20th, a Brimstone fluttering along the field margins beside Bulls Wood Lane.

Average rainfall of 58.5mm for the month.

#### March.

Overcast and grey to start, cold throughout (strong wind on 13th) until last few days when it warms up some much-needed sunshine. Below average rainfall spread widely over the month, amounts ranging low from 3mm to max 8mm at any one time. The first sound of the Chiffchaff was heard on 19th, a few days earlier than in 2020

#### April.

Rain almost non-existent recording a paltry 2mm for the whole month. A month comprising of a persistent cool breeze/wind originating from a North/Easterly direction. Mostly bright throughout with lengthy spells of sunshine and fewer cloudier days but the main feature was that of 'frost' and some hard ones at that with devastating impact for our fruit trees in blossom. Sleet/snow showers on 5th, 6th & 11th never amounted to any-thing significant and a litter pick to the War Memorial completed in the dry. UK wide the month recorded the lowest average minimum temperature since 1922.

#### May.

Average rainfall in a mixed month with at times cool winds but on the whole a much warmer and sunnier month. After a cool dry spring, the grass started growing well and becoming greener. Very localised and scattered thundery showers. Much improved conditions on Stowmarket Golf Course with lush well-manicured greens and excellent fairways after slow grass growth during the early Spring. Enjoyed the Bluebells at Arger Fen.

#### June.

Flaming June! Started well with copious amounts of warm and prolonged sunshine. So good in fact we travelled to enjoy a nature walk on Dunwich Heath with the added benefit of a NT vegan curried cauliflower and chickpea pasty for lunch. Thunderstorm on 17th and approx. 28mm or 1" of rain fell on 18th with a few overcast and cooler days to follow. Improved conditions and a return to warmth and sunshine but then the month ended up being dull and cloudy.

#### July.

Mixed weather for the first fortnight - sun, cloud, isolated showers and thunderstorms to give a typical British Summer climate. Mid-month very warm with agreeable amounts of sunshine. Able to see a good selection of butterflies in Bradfield Woods. A few humid days gradually built up enough energy for a biblical storm on Sunday 25th. In just 2 hours the Village experienced a rainfall total of 112mm or 4.4"; in nearby Brettenham, in front of gates of Old Buck School the road became a river that appeared to be in full flood.

The remainder of the month was mostly overcast and Storm Evert arrived on 30th giving very strong winds and showers. The Lion retreated and the Lamb arrived bringing warmth, sun and a gentle breeze.

#### August.

The first half was typical Summer weather - long spells of sunshine with isolated heavy thundery showers. Some very warm pleasant days enjoyed to the max.

Middle week mostly cloudy with light showers and this unsettled theme continued until the end of the month. Below average rainfall. A cloudy start on 18th then becoming sunny & warm. An early start on the golf course, rewarded with the best round of the year, a Gross 79 or 41 points and a reduction in H/C index to 13.4

#### September.

Late summer warmth and sunshine enjoyed during the first week then more unsettled with a pleasant mix of sunshine and cloud. Another torrent of rain occurred on Sunday 19th during a thunderstorm and just under 2" or 47.5mm fell within a very short timescale. The North Sea at this time of year pleasantly warm enough for a day trip and swim. The remainder of the month was again mixed with strong winds a dominant

#### feature. It was a wet finale.

#### October.

Above average rainfall with more cloudier days and mist becoming a feature. Some sunny days but daylight hours comprising of sunny periods were few and far between with not much more than 10 days of agreeable conditions, it almost felt on some days that summer was back again to keep up our spirits before the onset of winter with above average temperatures. In possession of OAP Bus Passes we set off to Lavenham on the Bus (3.5miles) then returned to Cockfield via footpaths both different routes measured over 9 miles!! Storm Aurore provided heavy overnight rain on 20th followed by isolated thunderstorms. Very mild on 28th but stiff breeze but did not stop a litter pick exercise to the Mill Corner, managed to fill two carrier bags with mostly drink & food items together with half a dozen used condoms (not nice but at least safe sex is adhered to).

#### November.

#### Average rainfall.

Still having to mow the lawn as the grass has not stopped growing. Our first real frost of the impending winter occurred on 2nd. Up to day 9 we enjoyed bright sunny weather, followed by misty murky overcast conditions; then more sun and the odd cloudy day. Little or no significant rain until the last weekend when 29mm or just over 1" was recorded. Significant covering of sleet on 27th. Storm Arwen arrived 25th but Suffolk was spared unlike the north of the UK.

#### December.

Storm Barra again affected the North but Suffolk experienced heavy overnight rain with showers on 5th. On 10th there was more persistent rain with localised flooding especially at The Stone where there were numerous casualties (1 car abandoned in the middle of the flood and 2 vans broken down on the Felsham side). Local infrastructure poorly maintained thus not allowing water to drain away sufficiently quick enough. Many sections of our roads had minor flooding especially where run off gulley's are blocked. Mild & dry on 15th enabling a litter pick to be fulfilled along Perrydown Lane with over 40+ Stella Artois cans retrieved along with a partly filled Prosecco bottle, why? Hopefully, a final mowing of lawns was the last for 2021. The remainder of the month was predominantly overcast with rain at times but on the very mild side for this time of year.

## **Computer Corner**

### Odds and Ends

#### Windows 11

At the time of writing regular updates to Windows 11 are being released to add missing functionality and fix reported issues. Originally, I advised waiting till the New Year before upgrading to Windows 11, assuming your computer qualifies for the update.

In fact, unless you have a compelling reason for wanting to be on Windows 11, my inclination would be to wait until it has been out for about 6 months, which will be March. If you have a new computer with Windows 11 already installed, then all you can sensibly do is ensure that it is set to receive updates automatically. This is normally the default setting.

#### Exploiting OneDrive

OneDrive is Microsoft's cloud storage product. Windows 11's file system comes with a section for OneDrive, and each MS account comes with 5Gb of OneDrive storage. On a Windows 11 computer, OneDrive folders are used in exactly the same way as other folders on your system. The difference is that OneDrive folders are synchronise to the cloud, from where they can be accessed by any other device logged into the same MS account.

This means files stored in a OneDrive folder are accessible from your smartphone or tablet via the free OneDrive app available for that device. You can also share a file or folder with anyone else via a generated link.

So don't ignore OneDrive on your system, or be intimidated by it. Trying copying a file into a OneDrive folder then see how you can view the file on any of your devices running the OneDrive app.

This has enabled community gatherings and confidence to grow and thus he CCC has responded positively.

A Christmas Tree was once again put on the green. Shining light into the darker months.

A number of speed quizzes were held which proved very popular , a big thank you to those who made this happen.

The Cinema started again in May and confidence to attend is steadily growing. This involved a lot of hard work for the team to organise within Covid restrictions. Well done to all.

A Sale Trail was held in July and was well supported with many interesting items being bought and sold.

The Cockfield Produce and Flower show was held in the Village Hall in September, it was inspiring to see how the thought of winning a rosette can prompt so many people to take part.

An event to get people together again after the "lock down" was held on Great Green in September. We had a band and disco on a covered trailer, he football club ran the bar and over 150 people attended. It was heart warming to see so many people together again enjoying themselves.

Earlier this year a very sensitive decision was taken by the Community Council trustees regarding the community minibus. Obviously during the pandemic the minibus was not used by the village but in the previous year it had had so little usage that the trustees questioned if it was still needed, The bus just about broke even financially but no funds were accruing to fund a replacement when the current bus reached the end of its life. Much of the usage was from outside the village and the trustees thought it unwise to risk community council funds to subsidise this usage.

A joint letter from the Community Council and the Parish Council was published in Green Links and on the Community Broadcast explaining the situation and asking for views, ideas and suggestions as to how the minibus could be better supported and utilised. Sadly there were very few responses and the Community Council concluded that the situation was unlikely to improve. A motion was put to the trustees and the majority vote was in favour of passing the minibus back to the Parish Council, its legal owners. Accordingly the bus was MOT'd, serviced and passed back to the Parish Council on 31st March 2021.

The Earl's Meadow, Bruff's Line and Jefferies Green project has really been a valuable asset for the community during these difficult times, a quiet, beautiful place to relax, wander and, sorry to say it, remain safely socially distanced in the fresh air. A credit to the team who has made it so!

During these times the Community Council has not been able to raise funds for the village so we joined a charitable Post Office donation scheme. A huge Thank you to all who have responded.

During this year the Community Council has donated £5000 to the new play area on Great Green and £5000 to the refurbishment of the village hall bar and kitchen area.

It is said that hard times bring out the best in people and that is certainly true for this village of caring people caring for people.

We say a big THANK YOU to Susan Metcalfe who is leaving us and welcome to Mr Tony Turner who is Joining us. Let us all strive for a safe and successful New Year

#### February's Advice Column



I keep seeing on the news that my bills could be going up soon. It's making me really worried, especially as I spent more on Christmas than I

should have done. How can I get my spending habits back on track in 2022?

A lot of people will be asking themselves this question right now. The good news is there are lots of things you can do to be more in control of your money and better prepared for the future.

Firstly, find out exactly what money you have coming in and going out each month. Be realistic about what you need for essentials like food and travel. Then you can set yourself a budget that you can stick to - take a look at the budgeting tool on the Citizens Advice website, <u>www.citizensadvice.org.uk</u>, to help you do this.

If any of your bills do go up in the coming year, you can go back to our budgeting tool anytime to create a new plan and stay in control. Our website tips on how to reduce your regular living costs may be helpful if you find you have more money going out than coming in at any point.

You should also make sure you're getting all the income you're entitled to. Use the income checker on the Citizens Advice website to see if you could be getting more support, such as benefits or government grants. You can also use this to make sure you're being paid the right wage.

If you've been using credit cards, your overdraft or store cards for your spending, it's understandable if these debts are causing you worry. It's important to prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first though. Not paying these has the most serious consequences. On the Citizens Advice website, we have advice about which bills you need to prioritise and the support available for paying these and other bills. Once you have planned how to pay your priority bills, the budgeting tool can help you plan how to repay credit cards, overdraft charges and store cards. Everyone's circumstances are different, particularly when it comes to managing personal finances. If you need more specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call out debt helpline – 0800 240 4420. You're not on your own.
