



For people living in the Parish of Cockfield the United Charities of Cockfield (the first dating from the 17th century and some later), still help those in need by providing some vital support.


Do you need help or do you know someone who might need assistance?

Cockfield Parish Council Notes



Summary report of the Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 25 November 2021

On-going residual actions:

Bandstand: Cllr Southgate had provided a work scope and specification to the Clerk for the refurbishment works to seek quotation. Whilst the paint work needed to be delayed until the spring the timber repairs should be actioned as soon as practicable.

Pavilion Balustrade: Quotations for the further external refurbishment remained outstanding. However, again this work would now be carried out in the Spring.

Village Hall Car Park: Cllr Cutting-Keyton had compiled a schedule of Maintenance work relating to the Village Hall Car Park. At this point mainly weeds and vegetation issues.

Suffolk County Councillor and Babergh District Councillor Reports.

Council Robert Lindsay provided a written report as he was not able to attend, which gave updates on;

£12.8m investment into ensuring Council buildings become carbon neutral,

Motions for full council meeting 2.12.21:

First motion calls on the County Council to urge Suffolk police to publicly commit to enforcing 20mph zones,

Second motion asks the County Council to confirm its responsibility to making our roads safer for Suffolk residents and vistors,

Shortage of Flu Jabs in East of England Lorry Route Map Review in Suffolk

Councillor Margaret Maybury submitted a written report covering her wider ward activities although nothing explicitly concerning Cockfield.

Councillor Clive Arthey noted we would soon hear about a key central government initiative roll out "Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans" (LCWIP)

Public comment:

Neil Ashton attended to advise he had been elected the chairman of the Community Council;

Paul Heather raised a number of concerns relating to highways / footpaths, which the Council would review / action.

Cllrs supported the amended scheme.

Clerk has notified BMSDC that the PC will not be commenting on this application as it is outside the Parish Boundary.

Decision: Appeal Dismissed.

Neighbourhood CIL: (New Bus Shelter at Mackenzie Place); A Street furniture application has now been lodged with SCC, this will allow us to provide a larger and updated bus shelter and bus stop facility.

Future of the Village Minibus:_The Working Group (Cllrs Southgate, Brinkley, Morley, Levett and Golding) had met to discuss opportunities for further use of the bus. It was agreed to continue with funding given the COVID situation and it is hoped circumstances next year will allow better conditions to promote the bus usage. The vehicle requires to be sign written similar to the previous bus, such it has greater visibility / appeal.

Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebrations 2022: Councillors heard that plans are still in the initial stages and the working group continued to explore cost and arrangements for the event.

Councillors agreed to purchase an Elm tree to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee as part of the "Green Canopy" Celebration.

BMSDC Draft Housing Land Supply Position Statement Consultation: The Parish Council saw no reason to make any formal comment to the Authority. It was noted the land supply as being in excess of the 5 year threshold at 6.86 years. A key value when considering planning applications and compliance.

Greens Management: Councillors noted that Tom Shepherd was no longer able to cut the perimeter of the Great Green. Therefore the Clerk would seek alternative providers for next season.

Glebe Land: It was agreed that the Parish Council purchase annual membership of the National Allotment Society at a cost of £55.00 + VAT.

Earls Meadow: Councillors noted the excellent work of the volunteers and in particular the dedication of Melvin Cocksedge in mowing and the like to keep the area in good condition.

Playground: The Clerk had met with the Contractor concerning the hand strap issue together with the matter raised on the insufficient safety surface. However, the contractor was able to demonstrate compliance with the requirement, after it was found the surface had been covered with soil.

Parish Paths: It was noted that action is required to repair / replace the footpath sign and bridge at the "Stone".

Other Assets: Maintenance work is required to the notice board at Crowbrook and the picnic table at Great Green.

Highways and Emergencies: It was noted that at Cross Green a hole directly abutting the A1141 had developed and was growing larger. This would be reported to highways as believed to be their responsibility

Please don't forget the Glass Recycling Bins in the Village Hall Car Park which bring in useful revenue for the Village Hall.

Additional waste

If your bin is too full or an item is too big to fit in, you may want to consider the following options.



Additional recycling

Any extra recycling that can't fit into the recycling bin can be put in any clear, see-through sack.

Place the sacks by the recycling bin on your recycling collection day.

Cardboard

Any cardboard that can't fit into the recycling bin needs to be flattened, with any packaging materials and polystyrene removed. Place the flattened cardboard by the recycling bin on your recycling collection day.

We are not able to collect soaked cardboard.

Additional refuse and garden waste

In Mid Suffolk only, we offer an authorised sack scheme for additional refuse (general rubbish) and garden waste.

This is a paid service and restrictions apply.

Any refuse or garden waste left by the bin in unauthorised sacks, such as black bags, will not be collected.

Recycling centres

Household and garden waste can be taken to one of the Suffolk Recycling Centres.

There are more than 1,000 recycling banks in Suffolk for a wide range of materials, including:

- glass
- textiles and clothing
- tins and cans
- small electricals

computer Corner

New Year Resolutions

With the last of the turkey sandwiches remaining, maybe it's time to turn our attention to some useful tasks we can carry out to get set up for the year:

Passwords

Yes passwords again! Don't use the same 1 or 2 passwords for your email addresses or secure website access. At the very least, use difficult to guess, unique passwords for financial and other important sites. Write them down somewhere secure if necessary. You can use a 3 word password system along with symbols to create a strong password.

For example: purple\$Cabbage*tarmac! or Bandage%carbon£Plastic*

If you use the same password, obviously if your password is cracked, then all your sites and perhaps emails are compromised.

Photos

Why not make a start on cleaning up and organising your collection of photos? Photos on the computer tend to grow and grow and become disorganised.

- Create plenty of folders and sub-folders to identify the primary topic of a set of images. Move your images around to place them in the subject folders
- Go through the photos and delete those that don't make the grade or are near duplicates
- An alternative is to use a program devoted to working with images and storing them in a library

Files

Just like photos, the whole file system will probably benefit from a reorganisation, even though you probably have fewer general files than photos.

Use folders and sub-folders to identify subjects for your files and move the files into their correct subject. Don't just store them all at the Documents level

Look in the Downloads folder and move files you want to keep into their subject folder

Delete duplicates such as filename(2), filename(3)
Delete empty folders of the form New Folder or New Folder
(2)

Lavenham Pre-school: Review of the year December 2020- November 2021

What a year it has been! The first half of the year was affected by both bad weather and lock-downs but we are proud that the pre-school remained open through most of the Covid-19 disruption to support the learning and development of the village's youngest residents. When the strictest Covid-19 rules eased in the summer we welcomed parents to attend their children's graduation, where we said goodbye and good luck to many of our children as they moved on to 'big school'.

September brought some changes as we welcomed new children and a new manager into the setting. The first month was spent making sure that all the children had settled in and were happy to come to Pre-school. Then slowly we introduced some new activities, like visiting the Library and the Tot Rock group in the Village Hall. The children are so excited about taking part in these trips! We were also invited by the Rev. Graham Naylor to visit church to learn more about Harvest and see the Harvest Display. The children had the chance to explore a variety of fruits, vegetable, and plants.

October started with an Ofsted visit! This was our first full inspection since moving to our purpose-built setting in 2017 – and we are very excited and proud to say that we were awarded with a GOOD rating, reflecting much of what we already felt about the quality of our setting and our staff. There were some very encouraging comments and great feedback from the Inspector. Building on some of the recommendations we are already looking to strengthen our connections with Lavenham Community Primary School to help our children with the transition to primary school.

Our next very exciting project is to introduce a Forest School for the children in our care. Many thanks to Mr. David Jones and his teamfrom the Woodland Project for helping us with preparing the site! During Forest School sessions children will have an opportunity to explore the natural environment, learn through play and improve their social, emotional, and physical skills. Forest School helps with building confidence, resilience, independence, and creative thinking. Children will have the chance to be adventurous and try their ideas in practice. But most important they will learn through play, getting muddy and messy, exploring with different textures, smells and all in harmony with nature!

Lavenham Pre-school is a charity run by Trustees who are all volunteers. Each year the charity holds an Annual General Meeting. This year the meeting will be held via Zoom, on Tuesday 14th December 2021. Unfortunately, some of our current Trustees will be standing down, therefore we are looking for new volunteers. We are particularly keen to recruit as trustees people with a financial background, and parents of children who attend the Pre-school. 



Samuel Finley Breese Morse was an accomplished artist who dearly wanted to succeed in his chosen career, even going so far as to travel from his home in America to study in Europe. But although he tried very hard to succeed, his career suffered many reversals and failed to prosper financially. The final straw came when he failed to obtain a valuable commission, the fee for which he really needed to bolster his dwindling finances. As a result of this he decided that, although he loved painting, it would not provide him with a viable career and so he decided to abandon it in favour of something else.

Samuel, as a Christian, knew that setbacks can happen to anyone, but he also knew that life's disappointments can so often lead to other and better God appointed opportunities. And so relying on the Bible's assurance to: "Trust in the Lord with all thy might and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy path" (Proverbs 3:5&6), Samuel who, had a scientific background in addition to art, focused his energies on electromagnetism and electronic communications. This work eventually led to the development of the electronic messaging system that is named after him and that we know to this day as Morse code.

It was relatively late in his life that Morse transferred his energies from art to inventing the electric telegraph, but with God neither age nor circumstances, past or present, have any bearing on the future capabilities of those who love Him (Psalm 75:7). Morse wanted success, preferably from art, but God led him to something else, that not only gave him worldwide fame but the gratification of knowing that the instantaneous communication system that he invented saved many thousands of lives; thus proving, once again, that God's way is best. And so it was that at the end of his life Morse, when asked to sum up his achievements, gave all the credit to God, saying simply: "It was God's work – not unto us but Thy name be all the praise".

For us all, New Year is, traditionally, a time to look back and to look forward. As we look back we may see failures and disappointments in our lives, but as Samuel Morse found out, these can be ordered by God for our benefit. And so, looking forward, we should trust God, who holds the key to the future, and rely on Him for the New Year and all that is to come thereafter.


